The German History Society is the principal forum for scholars working on any aspect and period of the history of German-speaking Europe in the U.K. Its activities include publishing a leading academic journal (*German History*), holding conferences and workshops involving leading researchers and generally promoting communication and collaboration among German historians both in the British Isles and abroad. It often works in close conjunction with the German Historical Institute in London.



The Society is particularly keen to promote postgraduate research on German history. It runs an annual '**Essay Prize**' competition offering a £500 award to the winning entry. The essay can be on any aspect of (Early) Modern German History, including the history of German-speaking people both within and beyond Europe. Membership conveys a range of additional benefits for students working towards a higher degree at a UK or overseas university, including:

- Possibility to apply for **financial support** of language courses, workshop organization and research projects (all up to £500) as well as conference attendance (up to £400) and participation in GHS events (up to £50).
